## Costs & Charging

### Membership

In order to allow Tiki Taka Football Academy to be sustainable and to provide teams with the required documentation and equipment, membership incurs an initial and a monthly fee.

- **Yearly membership joining fee £30.** This is paid once annually before the start of the new season. For a new member, this is paid at the point of joining then henceforth at the start of every new season on 1<sup>st</sup> July.
- **Monthly subs £24\*.** This is due to be paid on the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month.  
*\*Based on a single 1 - hour training per week plus one match per week for children playing in a team. Two hours of training per week = £36 per month. Three hours of training per week = £48 per month.*

NB: younger siblings' subs are half price.

Where possible, the club operates a 'cashless' system and as such, all payments should be paid into the club bank account. We advise coaches to avoid taking cash payments from parents. The Standing Order Instructions at the end of this document contains the details required to set up a standing order either via online banking or by taking the details into the local branch of your bank.

The membership fee from each player contributes to the cost of paying for a player to join the appropriate football league and be affiliated with the FA each year.

The monthly subs contribute to, but are not limited to, venue hire, adult supervision, equipment purchase and replacement, pitch hire and insurance. These costs are not necessarily incurred to the same value by the club on a monthly basis. Therefore, the required yearly contribution for each player (£288) is split between the 12 months of the year – henceforth, **subs must be paid each and every month, irrespective of whether the player attends training that week, for the duration of their time at the club.**

Late payment will be chased up by the Club Committee and where necessary the Club Accountants – Steve Astbury Accountancy Ltd. **As a result of missed or late payments, a player's insurance will lapse and as a result they will be banned from training and matches until the policy can be renewed.**

### Training Kits

TTFa have training kits, blue or black, depending upon the age group. These consist of:

- socks
- shorts
- t-shirt
- 1/4 zip
- jacket



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The items display the TTFA logo on the front and the player's initials. Kits are not compulsory – children are able to train in any suitable sportswear. If a parent chooses to purchase a kit, this is ordered through the club and the cost is paid into the club bank account. This kit becomes the property of the child and their parent. It is the parents' responsibility to provide suitable footwear and shin pads. Other kits items are also available to buy via the Kit Order Form which is attached in the Welcome Pack received by all new members..

## **Match Day Kits**

Once players enter Y2 at school, they are old enough to be entered into the league and play each weekend of the season for a TTFA team. Match kits for TTFA consist of:

- a red and white vertical striped top
- blue shorts and
- red & white socks.

Match kits are normally purchased via club fundraising or sponsorship. The match day kits remain the property of the club and if lost or damaged beyond reasonable wear and tear, parents will be expected to fund a replacement. Should a player leave the club, their match kit must be returned in full within 7 days of their final match or training session. All parents will be asked to sign and agree to these terms on receipt of a new match kit.

## **Private Tuition**

Tiki Taka Football Academy runs team training, matches and group development centres. The club does not offer 1 to 1 tuition or private coaching. Coaches and volunteers at the club are unable to offer any form of private tuition.

## **Tournaments**

During the off-season, there are often tournaments organised around the region that teams from TTFA may choose to enter. These tournaments usually have an entrance fee. These fees are not covered by the monthly payments from each player and the club would be unable to sustain itself if it was to fund these competitions. As a result, the cost of the entrance fee will be split between the players who are attending and playing. Parents may decline to pay the fee but their child will not be entered into the tournament. If a coach does not have enough entrants from his own team, he may approach, with the authorisation of the committee, players from a TTFA team at the same or a younger age group.



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The membership and monthly fees paid by parents cover the cost of entrance in the winter leagues only. Any summer or futsal leagues will be classified as a tournament and as such, will be subject to the guidelines above.

### Payments:

- ✓ 1 x payment of £30 to be taken immediately. (£60 if there are 2 siblings)
- ✓ Monthly payment of £24\* on the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month. (£36 if there are 2 siblings)  
*\*Based on a single 1 - hour training per week. Two hours of training per week = £36 per month. Three hours of training per week = £48 per month.*
